HOMELESS? IN SIMI VALLEY?

The County of Ventura 2009 Homeless count has now been completed. The total count of homeless for all of Ventura County is 1,715 persons. Of these, 303 were counted in Simi Valley. Of these 303 persons:

- 98 % were living on the street, 2% in facilities
- 5% were seniors (62+), 18% were between the ages of 18-24, 1% were unaccompanied youth (without parents) between the ages of 13-17
- 69% were men, 31% were women
- 69% of adults were white; 23% were Hispanic or Latino; 1% were American Indian or Alaskan Native; 3% were African-American or black; 1% were Asian/Pacific Islander; and 3% were other
- 67% were born in California
- 12% of the total number of persons counted were children
- 18 families were counted 10 two-parent families with children and 8 one-parent families with children.

20% of the homeless in Ventura County call Simi Valley "home". "Lord, when did we see you hungry and homeless and invite you in?"

From the Pastor...

My Dear Fellow Pilgrims,

Believe it or not, I do not care much for religion and do not consider myself a religious person. Now, before anyone goes off having a hissy-fit because their pastor has just announced he has abandoned the faith, let me explain what I mean by "religion" and "religious person."

I see religion as a system of empty rituals devised to occupy a person and make them acceptable before God, and are therefore an end in and of themselves. A religious person, therefore, is a person who unquestioningly follows these rituals believing by doing so they are being faithful to their God. So what's wrong with this? I believe it misses the point, and I believe Jesus would agree.

Throughout the Gospels we find Jesus being confronted by the religious people of his time. Very often these were the ones who claimed their faithfulness by their actions, and Jesus' unfaithfulness by his actions. They couldn't understand how Jesus could claim to be God, or claim to have been sent by God, when Jesus didn't follow their rules. Jesus didn't always wash his hands properly before eating. Jesus did what many considered "work" on the Sabbath. Jesus shared table fellowship with those who were considered outsiders and unacceptable. Jesus touched the untouchable and talked with those who were labeled "troublemakers." Interestingly enough, Jesus saved his harshest criticism for those who were most connected to these rules. ("This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines." Matthew 15:8-9)

If the truth is to be told, following Jesus is not a religion. For those of us who have always answered the survey question that asks "religion" as Christian or Lutheran, these words may come as a shock. Following Jesus is not a religion because instead of being a religion, following Jesus is a relationship. Following Jesus means that any rituals in which we participate that don't bring us close to God or neighbor is empty or meaningless. Following Jesus means loving and serving God by loving and serving others, rather than loving and serving a senseless and meaningless detail that can neither love us nor serve us in return.

Following Jesus is not religion but relationship – a relationship with the creator of the universe and the most powerful entity that will ever be known. Given the choice between performing senseless ritual that leads nowhere and having a relationship with the creator of the universe, which would you choose? Seems like a no
