# From the Pastor

My Dear Fellow Pilgrims,

I am one of those people who are unfortunate enough to speak only one language. I realize in our day and setting it would be very helpful to be able to speak Spanish as well as English. In the near future it could also be helpful to speak Chinese since China is quickly becoming a major player on the world stage. Given my struggle with languages, however, I don't expect that to happen soon – at least not in my life.

My inability to be bilingual makes me happy for symbols. It is now possible to get around many places in the world because we have developed some international symbols. Need to find a hospital? Look for the sign with the blue "H" and follow the arrows. Need to find a library? Look for the blue sign with the blue book and follow the arrows. Need a rest room? The international symbols now relieve the pressure of deciphering a foreign language and accidentally walking into the wrong room.

Symbols have been important throughout history. They were important in biblical times when the population was largely illiterate because a known symbol would help the illiterate identify or understand different words or concepts. One that we are familiar with, because it has come back into vogue in the past few years, is the fish symbol. The fish became an ancient symbol for Jesus because when the first letters of several titles of Jesus (Jesus Christ Son of God Savior) in Greek are put together they spell the Greek word for fish (ichthus).

One old symbol that catches a lot of heat this time of the year is when the word "Xmas" is substituted for the word "Christmas". We English speakers see the first letter "X" and assume it is one of our letters, not realizing the first Greek letter in Christ is a *chi*, which looks like our letter "X". Some people get up in arms that we are somehow trying to leave Christ out of Christmas when in fact the chi, along with the next letter in the Greek name "Christ" shows up on many of the paraments we use on the altar throughout the church year. In fact, the "chi-rho" is presently on the blue paraments we are using in the sanctuary for the season of Advent.

The exact origin of the single letter X for Christ cannot be pinpointed with any certainty. Some claim it began in the first century AD along with the other symbols. Others claim it came into widespread use by the 13<sup>th</sup> century along with many other abbreviations and symbols for Christianity and various Christian ideas that were popular in the Middle Ages.

In any case, by the  $15^{\text{th}}$  century Xmas emerged as a widely used symbol for Christmas. In 1436 Johannes Gutenberg invented the printing press with movable type. In the early days of printing typesetting was done by hand and was very tedious and expensive. As a result, abbreviations were common. In religious publications, the church began to use the abbreviation X (chi) for the word "Christ" to cut down on the cost of the books and pamphlets. From there, the abbreviation moved into general use in newspapers and other publications, and "Xmas" became an accepted way of printing "Christmas" (along with the abbreviations Xian and Xianity). Even Webster's Dictionary acknowledges that the abbreviation Xmas was in common use by the middle of the  $16^{\text{th}}$  century.

So there is no great conspiracy to take Christ out of Christmas. It's simply a matter of another symbol of the church that has lost its meaning over the centuries. Perhaps a working knowledge of biblical Greek would have kept the misconception from arising. But then, not many people study ancient Greek as a second language anymore. Merry Christmas to you all.

### HOMELESS? IN SIMI VALLEY?

The County of Ventura 2009 Homeless count has been updated. The total number of persons counted in Simi

Valley was 303. There were 266 adults and 37children. A breakdown of the data collected from adults is as follows:

1. Location 98% of persons (298) were counted on the streets and 2% (5) in facilities;

2. Age 5% of adults (12) were seniors (age 62+); 18% (48) were youth between the ages of

18 – 24; and 4 (1%) were unaccompanied youth (without parents) between the ages of 13-17.

3. Gender 69% of adults (183) were men and 31% (83) were women;

4. Ethnicity 69% of adults (183) were White; 23% (62) were Hispanic or Latino; 1% (2) were

American Indian or Alaskan Native; 3% (8) were African American or Black; 1% (3)

were Asian/Pacific Islander; and 3% (8) stated Other;

5. State Born 67% of adults (178) were born in California;

6. Children 12% (37) of the total number of persons counted were children;

7. Family Composition 18 families were counted—10 two-parent family with children and 8 one-parent

families with children. 20% of the homeless in Ventura County call Simi Valley "home". "Lord, when did we see you hungry and homeless and invite you in?"


