



HOMELESS? IN SIMI VALLEY?

The County of Ventura 2009 Homeless count has been updated. The total number of persons counted in Simi Valley was 303. There were 266 adults and 37children. A breakdown of the data collected from adults is as follows:

- **1. Location** 98% of persons (298) were counted on the streets and 2% (5) in facilities;
- **2. Age** 5% of adults (12) were seniors (age 62+); 18% (48) were youth between the ages of 18 24; and 4 (1%) were unaccompanied youth (without parents) between the ages of 13-17.
- **3. Gender** 69% of adults (183) were men and 31% (83) were women;
- **4. Ethnicity** 69% of adults (183) were White; 23% (62) were Hispanic or Latino; 1% (2) were American Indian or Alaskan Native; 3% (8) were African American or Black; 1% (3) were Asian/Pacific Islander; and 3% (8) stated Other;
- **5. State Born** 67% of adults (178) were born in California;
- **6. Children** 12% (37) of the total number of persons counted were children;
- **7. Family Composition** 18 families were counted—10 two-parent family with children and 8 one-parent families with children. 20% of the homeless in Ventura County call Simi Valley "home". "Lord, when did we see you hungry and homeless and invite you in?"

SCRIP NEWS

Today I read in the paper that the recession is still with us big time. It is hard to imagine being without a job, a home or enough food for our family, isn't it? Our hearts go out to those in such need and we look for ways to help.

Well, the Scrip program offers a perfect way to do this. For every gift card you buy and use, the merchant donates a percentage to your church. And the church dedicates a tithe of that free money to feed and clothe and house the less fortunate.

Here is an example. Say you enjoy eating at Islands, Red Robin, or Panera. Stop by the Scrip table and purchase a \$25 gift card. Then use that card to purchase a full \$25 worth of food from the restaurant. You have gotten full value for your money. It has cost you nothing extra. But wait! The restaurant gives SOV \$2.25 just to show their appreciation for your dining there!!! Because you took the time to purchase the gift card, you have enabled money to be funneled to the needy, which would otherwise not have been!

Are you planning repairs on your home? Need electronic supplies? Planning to buy new golf clubs? Shop at Kohl's, Macy's or WalMart? Like to get your craft supplies at JoAnn"s? Visit Family Christian Book Store? See a movie at Regal Theater? Stop at Starbuck's Just love Bath and Body? Border's?

We have about 100 stores that give us a percentage of what you spend. It is foolish not to take advantage of their generosity. Sometimes you have to order in advance as we cannot carry every card in stock every day. But any order you give us will be delivered to you the following Sunday in most cases. And of course, we always carry a large selection of the most asked for gift cards on hand.

The Scrip table is open every Sunday, rain or shine, on the patio (or in the Library in case of rain) between church services. Come talk to us about how you can support those who need help during these difficult times. God has called us to care for the least of these. Will you answer His call?
