My Dear Fellow Pilgrims,

Some time ago Corrine and I were sitting at a table at Chili's when an acquaintance approached us on their way out of the restaurant. The comment made on their way out has stuck with me and has even caused me to ponder its implications on a couple of occasions. The comment was simple, yet unlike many other parting remarks, couldn't be a simple toss away line as the thought is pregnant with possibilities.

So, what was said? "How is it we're willing to give a 15% tip to our wait person but so reluctant to give 10% to God?" There. It's laid out on the table for discussion. To me it's a profound question that could cause some real soul searching. The comment holds at least a kernel of truth – having known many people over the years who have worked in restaurants I have heard their perspective and know how much those tips help and how hard some individuals work for those tips. But I also know that a 15% tip on a \$30.00 food bill once a week doesn't seem like a big deal. Besides, if the tip is made at a restaurant we visit frequently I may also justify the tip by thinking, "This will ensure me good service next time I'm here – especially if I have the same wait person. I'm investing in good service for the future."

But 10% for God? Or even 5%? That can be a much different story because we would be talking much bigger numbers. Ten percent of \$30.00 wouldn't be much of a sacrifice, but for many of us our income is far more than \$30.00 a week. If we make \$1,000 a month, ten percent would be \$100. For some people \$100 seems like big money! Much more than we think we could afford to part with – even as a gift to God.

This brings me to the good news/bad news part of the discussion. The good news is this; the command for a 10% tithe comes from the Old Testament and appears not to be a command continued by Jesus. Hurray! Now for the bad news. Jesus says all we have, 100%, is due to God because everything we have and everything we are is only on loan to us and ultimately belongs to God anyhow. It's a bit like the old humorous tax form that went around at one time that had only two lines on it. The first line read, "Record your total income for the year on line one." The second line read, "Send a check for the total amount written on line one as your tax amount due."

How often do we really stop to consider the air we breathe, the food we eat, or the friends and family whose company we enjoy? How often do we consider our lives, our loves and those things in our lives that bring us joy? They are ours because of a benevolent God who does love and care for us. The bottom line is we do nothing each day to produce the air that we breathe. We do nothing to produce the friends and family we have. We do nothing to produce those things that bring us joy. All are gifts from God and all ultimately belong to God.

It's Stewardship time. As we ponder how much we can or should return to God by giving to the church consider those things we experience each day that we receive through no effort of our own. Whether it's 2%, or 5%, or 10% or 30% we offer back, can we ever truly give enough to thank God for all we receive?

Intriguing thoughts -15 % for the wait staff, no problem. Now, how much to return to God for all the bounty we receive? That is the million dollar question.

Better Than An Alleluia

Growing up in today's world is a hard thing. Young people face many more challenges than I did as a student. Families are torn apart by divorce, students can be bullied 24/7 because of the Internet, texting, and social networks, and much of what they learn is driven by the media. Where do students turn to learn about God, the gift of grace given to them by Jesus Christ, and the peace that passes all understanding brought to them by the Holy Spirit.

Sure, young people can learn about God in church. But more time than that is needed. Lutheran schools offer students the chance to learn about God for over thirty hours a week. What other ministry in our church has that kind of influence on a student's life.

We are living in what is termed the post-church era. Less and less people are coming to church to worship God and young people are not exposed to faith in their young lives. Many parents say that they will let their children to decide for themselves what faith they will practice. How can children decide on faith when there is no foundation?

So, here is our mission. Let the Gospel be the voice our children hear for over 30 hours each week. The media is getting at least that much time to influence our children. Dedicating ourselves to the idea of outreach in our schools is hard, it is frightening, and it costs money. But this dedication pays off because from our schools come our future church leaders and children who can bring faith to our community. As Amy Grant sings, this hard work is "better than an alleluia sometimes."
