Even as cynical as I can be at times, that description is a little over the top even for me.

Thanksgiving to me conjures up images of waking early to the aroma of pumpkin pie and turkey cooking, holiday parades that include Santa Claus,




dawn till dusk football, scouring the morning paper to find the best deals on Friday morning, and getting myself more stuffed than the turkey itself. These are little snippets from looking back over the last fifty some years. Many of the memories are happy ones, except for the discomfort I remember from eating too much. As I understand it, when President Abraham Lincoln set aside a national day of Thanksgiving nearly 150 years ago, the idea was to reflect on and give thanks for our Godgiven blessings. SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR GRADES K-12


\* Grades K-8 meet at 9:45 am each Sunday. Students meet upstairs in the classrooms and return to church after the sermon so they can commune with their families.



# Interface Ministry

As an ongoing ministry of SVLC we collect items for personal care bags at the monthly Women's Circles, or by taking your donation to the Church office. These items then go into a care bag and are given to Interface for their Battered Women's Shelters throughout the county. The items needed to make a care bag are (in regular sizes): shampoo, conditioner, brush, comb, lotion, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, deodorant, tampons, disposable razors, pocket size Kleenex. Last year twenty bags were donated to Interface!

Christ Caring for People through People - That's the motto of Stephen Ministry.

The Stephen Minister's role is to bring God's love into the lives of people who are going through a difficult time or experiencing a crisis. What do Stephen Ministers do? They listen to you, care for you, support and encourage you, and pray with and for you. And in the midst of this confidential, one-to-one, caring relationship, God's healing love comes pouring through.

#### What you should know about Stephen Ministry

Shepherd of the Valley has a system for training and organizing laypeople to provide one-to-one Christian care to hurting people in our congregation called <u>Stephen Ministry</u>. All Stephen Ministers receive 50 hours of training in care giving and attend continuing education classes every month that prepares them to listen and care for anyone going through a difficult time. The name Stephen comes from St. Stephen, who was the first layperson commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need, (Acts 6).

Stephen Ministry began in 1975 when the Rev. Kenneth C. Haugk, Ph.D., a pastor and clinical psychologist, trained nine laypeople at his congregation in St. Louis to be **Stephen Ministers.** They assisted him in providing distinctively Christian care to members of the congregation and community. These trained caregivers were so enthused about their ministry; they encouraged Dr. Haugk to offer it to more congregations. Since that time more than 500,000 laypeople have been trained as **Stephen Ministers** in 50 states, 10 Canadian provinces and 24 other countries.


