Dear Fellow Pilgrims,

Some people have a gift for taking what is complicated and make it simple. That seems to be the appeal of many Apple products. The Apple Corporation it seems has always tried to take what is complicated and make it simple.

Other people have a gift for taking what is simple and making it complicated. Sometimes I think these are the people hired to write instruction manuals for many of the products I purchase. I don't consider myself to be a dumb person, yet there are some manuals I'll read and be as confused as if I were trying to read the instructions in a foreign language. I understand little or none of it.

Sometimes I feel that way about the church – that somehow along the way we've taken what is simple and made it complicated. It seems to me that all along all God has ever asked of us is that we love God and love one another. Through the prophet Micah God showed anger at the Jewish people who sought to appease God by their sacrifices. "With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul? He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God."

In Jesus' time an intellectual exercise involved debating over which of the items of the Jewish religious law was most important. (Video games were still 2,000 years away and they had to amuse themselves somehow.) When the question was posed to Jesus he responded by saying, "You shall love the Lord your God with all you heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27) When pressed by the questioner to define the term "neighbor," Jesus went on to tell what we know as the parable of the Good Samaritan.

Many Christian congregations across the country are presently in major decline. Even we at Shepherd of the Valley wonder about our future with the way the culture is changing. "How will we bring in more members?" is a question many are currently debating – including the Church Council. There is still a part of me that is naive enough to believe we are taking what is simple and making it too complex and that all we need to do is exactly what Jesus' told the debater. I believe if we could really do that we would have more people here than we could handle. Do you suppose Jesus was onto something? Could it possibly work?

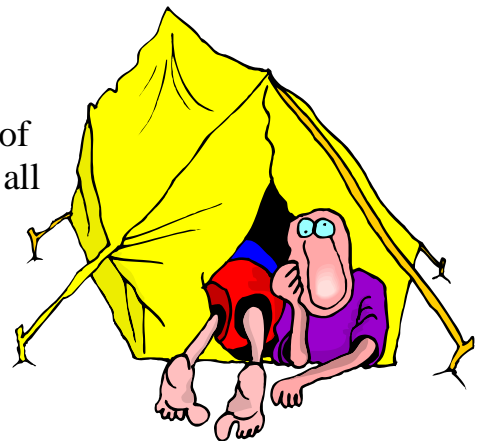

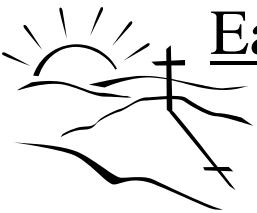

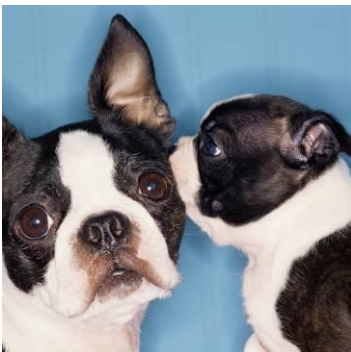

2012 ELCA Youth Gathering Update April 2012

We are excited to announce that we have had another youth join the group going to New Orleans bringing the total to 18 youth and 5 adult leaders. That pushes our goal up to \$27,000.00. We have had three of our six bible studies so far and have been very busy with many fundraisers.

The secret prayer partner for the youth and adult leaders is in the process and many youth have been participating in various service projects within the church.

The Stephen Minister's role is to bring God's love into the lives of people who are going through a difficult time or experiencing a crisis. What do Stephen Ministers do? They listen to you, care for you, support and encourage you, and pray with and for you. And in the midst of this confidential, one-to-one, caring relationship, God's healing love comes pouring through.

What you should know about Stephen Ministry

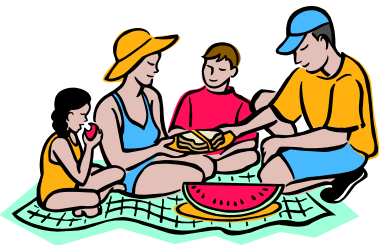
Shepherd of the Valley has a system for training and organizing laypeople to provide one-to-one Christian care to hurting people in our congregation called **Stephen Ministry**. All Stephen Ministers receive 50 hours of training in care giving and attend continuing education classes every month that prepares them to listen and care for anyone going through a difficult time. The name Stephen comes from St. Stephen, who was the first layperson commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need, (Acts 6).

Stephen Ministry began in 1975 when the Rev. Kenneth C. Haugk, Ph.D., a pastor and clinical psychologist, trained nine laypeople at his congregation in St. Louis to be **Stephen Ministers**. They assisted him in providing distinctively Christian care to members of the congregation and community. These trained caregivers were so enthused about their ministry; they encouraged Dr. Haugk to offer it to more congregations. Since that time more than 500,000 laypeople have been trained as **Stephen Ministers** in 50 states, 10 Canadian provinces and 24 other countries. **If you or someone you know is facing a crisis--large or small--and could benefit from the caring presence of a Stephen Minister, call Pastor Gary at 805.526.7577.**
